# **St Joseph's Primary School Newsletter**

Dear Parents/Carers,

On Monday we celebrated our Opening School Year Mass at our beautifully refurbished parish church. For many children, it was their first time attending Mass in this church, and they were very surprised at the beautiful sanctuary that is now the setting for the celebration of Eucharist. There is no clue on the externals of our church building as to the beauty within.

We teach our children that what is inside of us is more important than our external image. Good looks don't always guarantee a good heart.

In his homily, Fr Andrew spoke of discipleship, learning from a master and then becoming like that master, Jesus. We have examples of this in popular culture: Star Wars - Luke Skywalker learning to "use the force" from the master, Yoda; Karate Kid - Dre Parker learning from the master, Mr Han. Both these are positive examples of discipleship and a good segue way into Jesus, our spiritual Master. While Yoda and Mr Han taught their disciples to conquer evil, Jesus calls his disciples into a life of love with the Father. Christian discipleship is about spreading Good News, about living out love and about relationship with God, relationship nurtured by prayer, - conversations with God. Love starves evil of oxygen, love begets love.

Christian discipleship is probably not as exciting as excelling in karate or using lightsabers, but Christian discipleship is relationship with God who loves unconditionally and eternally. Our children have a right to this awesome gift. Let's nurture it together!

Next Sunday, 23rd February, parents are invited to bring their children from Year 3 or above, and enrol in the Reconciliation Sacramental programme. This follows the 10am Mass at St Joseph's church and is for children who have been baptised in the Catholic church. Presenting your child for a sacramental programme, is a commitment from you, the parents/carers, that you will support your child's faith journey as a member of the Catholic Church.

Our Strings programme (Years 3 & 4) is off to a good start this year. There were a number of questions about how it all works, especially around tutors and the school orchestra. We will send specific information about this to the classes involved. Orchestra rehearsal (for students in Years 3-6) is now at 1.30 - 2.30pm on Wednesdays. This means students are rehearsing during Lunch 2 and the first 30mins of the afternoon session. We are trialling this arrangement for Term 1 as many students were unable to attend the after school rehearsals. Class teachers are looking at ways to ensure students do not miss any instruction.

We have begun interviewing for Kinder 2015. New families have visited the school this week during our open times and taken enrolment packs with them. We urge parents who have a child for Kinder 2015 to contact us for an appointment as we will be sending out our first round offers of enrolment in May.

Next Monday, Years 3-6 children will have a special presentation at 10.30am from the Panthers' "Tackle Bullying" programme. Children are invited to bring items for the players to sign. These items must be kept in a separate bag and not taken into the playground.

Last Thursday was Apology Day. Students in Years 3-6 revisited the historic apology made in the Australian Parliament to our indigenous people. It is important to remember our history.

A homework consultation paper is coming out to parents next Monday. There will be no homework from classes until a decision is made.


