Dear Parents/Carers,

Today is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Traditionally, we practice fasting and abstinence by "giving up something for Lent." Maureen McCann Waldron, in her Reflection published in <u>Creighton University's</u> <u>Online Ministries</u>, brings a new perspective to this Lenten practice and puts it into the context of joy.

When I was in grade school, I remember Ash Wednesday as a melancholy day. The sisters who taught us were unusually sombre and whispery to us that day. It felt like Ash Wednesday, with its marked foreheads and meagre meals, signalled the beginning of a long period of giving up candy – and some feeling that we were all lost.

But many decades later, a look at today's readings changes my perspective and seems to invite us into a hopeful joy. God invites us to "return to me with your whole heart" and we ask God in return to "create a clean heart for me and a steadfast spirit renew within me."

Rather than being melancholy, Lent invites us into a deep joy, for we are known by God as imperfect people but we are loved by God as forgiven. The deeply forgiving love God extends to us is like an invitation to renew our relationship with God.

Yes, it might be a period of simplicity, paring down and clearing away the things that are getting in the way between us and God. Lent can be a time to take a clear-eyed look at ourselves and honestly see who we are, just as God does. But **it's a time of great hope, as we realize how much God longs for a relationship with us.**

That doesn't mean we focus on us and our failings, but we can look at the way our lack of freedom gets in the way of our relationships with God. An honest look at ourselves as flawed creatures of God doesn't mean we give up. Rather we can rejoice in knowing that there is nothing we have done, no act or way of life, no hidden sin so deeply tucked away in our souls, that God does not forgive in us.

Can we imagine the next six weeks as time to spend with one who loves us so much, who forgives and comforts us and rejoices in our love? And isn't that celebration of love even deeper and more joyful if we have been separated from God for a while?

Today many of us will have our foreheads marked by a cross of ashes. It is a shocking symbol of our own mortality and of the sacrifice Jesus made for us with his death. It is also a public marking that reminds us - and others - of God's message to us, "I created you for myself and gave you my only son to free you from sin and death. Even now, I am calling you, drawing you closer to myself so that someday, I can celebrate with you a never ending banquet of love."

The ashes on our forehead are more than a symbol of our own mortality. They are a sign of God fighting for our freedom from this world, liberating us from the clutches of so many things that drag us away from God. Today Jesus is calling us to himself in an ever-deeper way, inviting us into his endless forgiveness and asking us to return to his loving embrace. With tears of joy, we can accept his outstretched arms. When I was a girl my sense of Ash Wednesday was that we were lost. Now I see that we are found!

This is the Good News we will share with our students during Lent. We will provide opportunities for prayer, alms-giving and fasting with a focus on enriching our life and that of others. A focus on living and sharing the joy of the Gospel.

We will have special Lenten prayer at our assembly on Mondays, we will encourage donations to support Project Compassion (Caritas), and we will hold "No junk food day" to give thanks for the food that meets our **needs**, and donate cost of unnecessary food we **want** to others. A special Lenten newsletter will come out next Monday.

What can you do as a family to grow in your relationship with each other and God this Lent?

When Your Child is Sick...

If your child is absent for only 1-2 school days, it is not necessary to phone the school. However, if they will be absent for more than two consecutive school days, please contact us. A signed and dated note for any day a child is absent, explaining the reason for absence, must be provided when the child returns even when a phone call has already been made. These notes are required for our school records and should be given to the class teacher. Principals may request medical certificates, or other documentation, when absences due to sickness are frequent or prolonged.

Arriving Late to School

At St Joseph's we value and protect all day learning time, however, we appreciate that there will be times when children arrive late. If your child is late they miss out on important instructions and they may also disrupt the class when they arrive. Punctuality assists children to settle in the morning and reduces the amount of interruptions to a class.

If your child arrives after 8:50 am parents are asked to please accompany their child to the office to sign them in.


