Dear Parents and Carers,

It is fitting that Mothers' Day is celebrated in the month of May: the month dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. Mary experienced the challenges of being a mother, not the least of which was watching her son be humiliated, scorned, physically abused and executed. Being a mother is a journey that requires courage, unconditional love, humility and strong faith.

Mothers shape the lives of their children, encouraging and motivating them to be the best they can be. Mothers are instrumental in showing their children the love of God. They are the first educators of their child in faith. They are saints!

On Sunday April 27th, Pope Francis gave us two new Saints when he canonised Pope John XXIII and Pope John-Paul II. These two men brought the Catholic Church into the modern era, acknowledging the role of all the people of God and going out to the world as witnesses of Christ.

Saint John XXIII (1881-1963) -- known as Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli before he became pope -- was one of 13 children born into a family of Italian peasants, farmers from a tiny village in the country's north. He was sent away to study for the priesthood at age 11. He was elected Pope in 1958 and opened the Second Vatican Council (Vatican II) in 1962. Pope John XXIII died before the Council was completed in 1965.

Saint John Paul II (1920-2005), born Karol Jozef Wojtyla, was brought up in a grimy industrial town in Poland and raised by his soldier father after his mother died when he was just 8 years old. He spent his formative years living under first Nazis, then Communists. He became Pope in 1978 and led the Catholic Church until his death in 2005.

These two popes approached the mission of the Church in different ways, but they were both faith-filled, courageous and committed to spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world. They are truly heroes of our Church.





Adult Migrant English Program - FREE English Classes

The Adult Migrant English Program is funded by the Australian Government Department of Industry. This program provides basic English as second language tuition to help migrants and refugees from non-English speaking backgrounds settle successfully in Australia. If you are eligible you can study English through the AMEP at Macquarie Community College Blacktown, Mt. Druitt and Ermington for up to 510 hours (or more) or until you reach a functional level of English. We also provide supplementary courses in English Through Computers, Australian Society/Computer Skills and Pathway to Work courses. Students also have access to flexible and diverse modes of English language learning.
