We experienced some particularly poor examples of respect for authority on Tuesday afternoon, as parents made derogatory comments about the policeman patrolling the Kiss 'n' Ride zone. Some of the parents I overheard, had not even been involved in being moved on or fined. As there were many children sitting nearby, they also heard the abusive comments. So, what are we teaching our children? There are proper channels and processes for complaints. We all have the right to use these and make our feelings known, but let's not teach our children to disrespect police officers.

Confirmation

Child Protection Protocols

Student Attendance

Late arrival to school

School hours are 8.50am to 3.00pm.

When students arrive, even 5 mins late, they have to "play catch up."

- Greetings have already been exchanged;
- Instructions have already been given;
- Learning has begun!

Late arrivals are recorded and appear on Student Reports. When no adult is present to sign late students in, it is recorded as "unexplained".

Parents/carers are urged to ensure students arrive on time at school each day.



Student absences

Parents must notify the school when students are unable to attend. Notification can be made by phoning the school office, email, or a written letter. Where an absence for sickness extends beyond one day, please notify the school with an approximate date of return. A medical certificate may be requested by the school if absences are frequent.

Extended leave, other than sick leave, requires an application to the principal prior to leave being taken. This is a legislative requirement.

Dismissal Procedures

There are three dismissal points at the school:

Bus Gate – ONLY for students catching buses;

Kiss 'N' Ride Gate – for students waiting to be picked up by car;

Walkers – for students picked up by parent/carers who either have left their cars to collect their children or are walking their children home.

Students not catching a bus or being collected by a car at Kiss'n'Ride, will be waiting in the Walkers area behind the admin building.

Our dismissal procedures are to keep our students safe and support teachers in managing the supervision of students. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Safety First on our Street

Some parents continue to abuse the safety rules when dropping off and collecting their children. A minute's poor decision can cause a lifetime of pain.

- The administration driveway is NOT for U-turns or dropping off and picking up children.
- Blocking vision of the children's crossing is illegal.
- Blocking residents' driveways and the street, is inconsiderate to say the least.

Teachers are on duty till 3.30pm and no child is ever left alone to wait for parents. It stands to reason that not every one of our 266 students can all be collected at 3pm. Be prepared to wait or walk. Every parent, student and staff thank you for looking out for the safety of each one of our children. Please do your bit.
