Message From Mrs Reilly...

Dear parents and guardians,

I had an absolutely wonderful time whilst I was on the pilgrimage to the Holy Land, Rome and Assisi. I got to visit so many special and holy places and enjoyed the company of my fellow pilgrims who came from schools across our diocese. It was also an opportunity for me to reflect on myself and my role as principal of St. Joseph's. I spent many hours gazing out the bus window thinking about our school and how we can continue to provide the very best for each child.

One of my inspirations: working together. It is only through working together that we will achieve a safe, happy and learning community. It is only through working together - parents, staff and children that we can move forward and solve any problems.

What does this working together look like?

We can't work together unless we are communicating. The school is sharing lots more information about what is happening in classrooms through Facebook and Skoolbag. We've created the opportunity for parents to be in the school grounds before and after school which gives teachers opportunities to greet and chat to parents and organise times for additional meetings as needed. Moving the weekly assembly to Friday afternoon has also meant that more parents can be involved in celebrating the week's work. Our Grandparents' and Mothers' Day celebrations were joyful and filled with the spirit of community - a community of love and caring.

Teachers are being proactive in organising interviews with parents about students' learning and behaviour. Together parents and teachers plan a way forward for the child. There are very few "quick, easy solutions" but by working together positive steps can be made. Many parents are also being proactive and contacting their child's classroom teacher about concerns they are having. Often the classroom teacher can deal with them but sometimes the help of leadership and our school counsellor is required.

We can't work with you unless you communicate your concerns. I have invited many parents to share the message - please contact the school if you or your child are worried about anything. Your first stop is your child's classroom teacher - email, ring, write and ask for a meeting. If the teacher feels that additional help is required then myself, Lisa or Vennessa will become involved in supporting everyone in doing the best for our children.

Another way to build this team is by you becoming involved in school activities. There were only five parents at the Parent Association Meeting last week. Unfortunately no decisions could be made as there were not enough people to vote. We would love to have Fun Food Days, Movie Nights, Bingo and Discos but without parents to help run them we are at a standstill. Currently we have four parents who have offered to help at the Athletics Carnival. The event cannot be successful unless there are adults who can support the teachers. On a positive note, there were many mums and nans helping out at the Easter raffle, Mothers' Day stall and secondhand uniform shop. There are other parents who contribute by covering books, selling Zooper Doopers and in many other ways. It is a powerful message you are giving to your child when you volunteer. You are showing them that the community is important to you and that you want to work together with staff to ensure the very best for our children of St Joseph's.

Complaints Handling Policy Reminder for our school community:

If, at any time, you find that you have a concern with St Joseph's Primary School, you are encouraged to come to the school and speak with the teacher/s, assistant principal and/or principal, to identify your concern. It is our aim to work with all members of our school community to ensure we do the very best to provide a productive, safe and enjoyable learning experience for our students and professionally fulfilling experience for our staff.

If you would like to raise a concern, the Catholic Education Office has guidelines for ensuring that complaints are handled fairly. Information about how to handle complaints either informally or formally is available from the school office and/or within the Complaint Handling Guidelines. These documents can be accessed on our school website or on the CEDP website. Complaint forms are available in the school office and can be downloaded from Skoolbag.

Volunteers and Child Protection

If parents are planning on assisting in the classroom, or on an excursion, they are required to first complete Child Protection Training. The training is undertaken over the internet at http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au/training Simply click the training link under "Volunteer" to undertake the training. **This needs to be renewed every 2 years.**

Kiss 'n' Ride

Children who are being picked up at Kiss 'n' Ride will sit near the top gate. When they hear their family name called they will then walk to the gate and wait with the teacher who will assist them to enter their car. Parents are asked not to leave the car in this section to pick up children.

Please **DO NOT** park across the road to pick your child up from Kiss 'n' Ride. If you wish to park your car you're welcome to pick your child up from Walkers (through the Kindergarten gate, behind the administration building). This is for the safety of all students, staff and parents.

If there is a line up of cars longer than the "No Parking" zone you MUST continue to drive around the block until there is room for you to join the line. Cars waiting in the middle of the road are blocking traffic and are standing illegally. Police, Parking Rangers and the School Office are regularly called by residents and parents who are concerned about safety.

There are three Open Mornings specifically for Year 7 2019 enrolments to be held on:


Tuesday 16th May, Wednesday 18th October and Monday 6th November 2017 9.15 – 11am
