Parent Questionnaire News

Though we received only 16 responses, the feedback was valuable. A summary of the responses and discussion at the Parent Association meeting last Monday is attached.

Number of surveys distributed - 304 Number of responses received - 16 Number of parents at PA meeting on Monday 2nd November to discuss survey response - 6

Student Semester 1 Report – this year we did not include any comments to encourage parent attendance at the Parent/Teacher interview. Semester 2 Reports will have comments provided for Religious Education, English, Mathematics and a General Comment.

Response:

Comments on report:

- drive parent / teacher conversation
- give purpose to meeting with the teacher
- provide overview of how child is progressing
- need to focus on child's learning sometimes too vague
- interview important with or without comments on report

General:

- 15 mins too short for interview
- Report format needs to be explained
- Working parents have difficulty attending consider implications of phone interviews as an alternative

Action:

- Comments to be included in both Semester 1 and Semester 2 Student Reports
- Use of technology for parent/teacher interviews to be explored
- School to be more proactive in ensuring parents are aware of option to have interview with teacher, by appointment, whenever needed.

Parent Teacher Interviews were not well attended this year. We included attendance by students to change the focus from reporting to setting goals for student learning based on the Student Report. How can we improve this process? Was it helpful to have the student at the interview? Were available times enough?

Response:

There was a mixed response to having students present for the interview

- Goal setting a positive initiative
- Child at interview important / useful / involved in process
- Reports not informative nothing to discuss
- Children didn't know why they were at the interview not prepared for goal setting
- Goal setting would be better earlier in the year
- Conflict of suitable time working hours / child's bedtime
- Time with teacher first, then include student
- Interview with / without child work well

Action:

- School to explore Goal setting meetings early Term 1
- Students to be prepared to be engaged in "learning conference"
- School to set out and promote procedures for parent teacher meetings other then set Parent/Teacher interview times.

Meet the Teacher Night Term 1 – We have noticed a decline in parent attendance. How else can we connect parents and teachers in a meaningful way early in Term 1? How else can we communicate the direction of the school to parents?

Response:

- Prefer one-on-one to general meeting
- Difficult to attend for working parents
- More explicit written information as an alternative to large meeting
- Publish teacher profiles with photos
- More opportunities throughout the year to meet with teacher

Action:

- School to liase with Parent Association to hold social 'meet and greet' function early in Term 1 target Kinder parents?
- Staffing / school direction to be communicated electronically using Skoolbag
- School to explore Goal setting meetings early Term 1

Homework – Our homework policy focuses on daily reading and unit based activities as described on the Term Overview for each class. What works well with this model? What are the challenges?

Response

- Inconsistency across school re homework expectations
- Homework provides parents insight into what children are learning
- More structured homework provide opportunity for parents to help children with their learning

Action

- School to revisit Homework Policy
 - consistent expectations
 - \circ frequency of communication
 - o resources e.g. readers
 - $\circ \quad \text{use of technology for homework} \\$
- Revision to be communicated to parents early 2016

Newsletter/Communication – We are looking at using the *Skoolbag App* to publish our newsletter and general communication for parents.

Response

- Positive response to Skoolbag App
- Already used by local secondary school, primary schools
- Paper copy of Term@ A Glance preferred

Action

- School subscribe to Skoolbag and implement asap
- Skoolbag to run parallel to current paper communication until end of 2015.
- Parents to be sent information on accessing Skoolbag App
- Skoolbag to be used for all school communication in 2016. Paper copies of Newsletter available in school foyer for visitors and parents who require paper format.

Parent Meetings/Parent Workshops – How can we increase parent participation? How can we make these more relevant/valued? Is there another way to collaborate?

Response

- Workshops fantastic
- Difficult for working parents to attend
- Schedule some workshops for evenings
- Provide more notice of upcoming events
- Restrictions on bringing toddlers make it difficult to attend
- Allow students to attend workshop with their parents
- Use technology

Action

- School to explore creating video clips to teach parents specific strategies used at school for e.g. maths, reading, writing
- Plan workshops for year and promote to increase parent attendance

Open Classrooms / Sporting events / Performances – It is important for parents to engage with our learning agenda and experience the work of the school. How can we expand this agenda from what we already offer?

Response

- Increase opportunities for 'open classrooms' so parents can see what is happening at school
- What is happening now, works well
- Organise more family excursions outside of school day e.g. UWS Observatory; Joan Sutherland Centre
- Remind parents more frequently of what school has to offer and age children can access different activities
- More promotion of sporting activities
- Use technology to share the learning

Action

- Promote 'open classroom' events at beginning of year
- Promote local family learning events Parent Association / parents to coordinate???
- Acknowledge student participation in school events more publicly
- Explore use of technology to communicate learning

Parent Association – We need more participation than the quorum of seven (7) at our meetings. While parents are generous in giving their time for fundraising events, meetings are poorly attended. Is having a Parent Association still relevant? How does a PA reflect the work of the Parramatta Parent Representative Council?

Response

- Family / work commitments / lack of childcare prevent attendance
- Communication required around
 - Role Parent Association
 - $\circ \quad \text{How does PA benefit the school} \\$
 - o Role of Parramatta Parent Representative Council
 - o Advance notice of meeting dates
 - Inclusion / welcome of all

Action

- Constitution of Parent Association to be sent out to all parents prior to AGM in Term 1 2016
- President's report outlining achievements of 2015 to be published
- Role and activities of PPRC to be included in newsletter 2016
- Date for AGM to be advertised beginning of Term 1 2016

What other ideas could we explore to bring our school community together?
