"Can't believe all the great things happening at St. Joseph's."












### **Counsellor's Corner**

#### **Showing Respect - Active Bystanders**

At St Joseph's Being Respectful is a key value during learning time and at play, we encourage respect in the way we talk to each other and share space with each other. We encourage all children to report concerns around behaviour that is leading to upset, this includes verbal and physical behaviour - with the view that asking for help shares the responsibility and allows teachers - in class and on duty the opportunity to respond to the concerns and to provide support.

To help model respect and to show support for each other, we are encouraging students to be active bystander's and support each other. Bystanders have the power to play a part in helping to identify bullying and helping to minimize how long it goes on for.

Active Bystander's do not need to take responsibility for the Bullies actions – they need to make their own actions count.

There is strength in numbers; Bystanders can combat bullying issues by showing their disapproval towards bullying behaviours by

#### Direct action -

- o Take the victim away from the bully just walk up and walk away together
- o Tell the bully to stop and remember asking for help is a right you have in our school and any school
- o Don't laugh the bully will see this as you agreeing with their behaviour Sometimes Bystanders think that what is happening is funny and they laugh, encourage or accept what is happening which can lead to feeling powerless, guilty or anxious about what is going on we can activate our children to make their actions count by asking for help and reporting things that feel bad.

#### Engage adults -

**Get help –** report your concerns to the teacher on duty, stay with that teacher until they are able to see how important the situation is or this can be by approaching a teacher you trust

Encouraging our students to take action and be active bystanders to show their respect for each other will build their strength on Joey's Journey.

#### Speaking respectfully to others

At St. Joseph's one of the key ways for students to be on Joey's Journey as Safe, Respectful Learners is to **speak respectfully to others.**Students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are aware of this goal and what it looks like in class and on the playground.

When speaking to teachers, classmates or peers we use a **friendly tone**, **kind words**, **eye contact and appropriate facial expressions**. When we do this, we communicate in a friendly way that is respectful. When others are speaking, we show them we are listening by facing them and using active listening skills.



On the playground, speaking respectfully sounds like:

- friendly talk during games
- words of encouragement like "Great effort, maybe next time!"
- words that show good sportsmanship like "Good game" and gestures like a handshake or thumbs up

Teachers reinforce this behaviour through praise and feedback, for example, 'I like the kind words you chose and how you spoke in a friendly tone'. Teachers will prompt students who are not achieving this goal with time to practise, re-teaching opportunities, and the class based system of managing non-compliant behaviours if needed.

You can help your children practise speaking respectfully through modelling this at home. For example, using kind words to each other, speaking in a calm and friendly tone, using words of encouragement at weekend sports like 'great effort', and showing active listening skills when your child is speaking.

We are all on **Joey's Journey of being Safe**, **Respectful Learners** together.



## How to keep your child safe online



#### Here are some tips for parents to keep your child safe online

#### RE SAFE

- Be aware of how your child uses the internet and explore it with them
- Set rules and monitor to make sure your child knows what information they can share or post online and which websites they can visit
- Teach your child to tell a trusted adult if they feel uncomfortable about something they have found on the internet or received in an email
- Discuss with your child the importance of ixeeping personal information private. This sort of information can be used to identify or locate where they live, go to school or activities in which they are involved.

#### BE RESPECTFUL

- Talk to your children about cyberbullying. Online communication should be responsible and respectful
- Children and adolescents who are being cyberbullied sometimes change their behaviour. If you are concerned they might be a victim of cyberbullying, talk to them and tell them you are concerned. Arrange to talk to a teacher or school counsellor
- Advise your child not to respond to any negative messages and to keep evidence. Tell them to report any negative messages they receive to you or another trusted
- Children and their parents can contact social media companies and ask for defamatory material to be taken down. If the material is not gone within 48 hours, a complaint can be lodged with the Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner at www.esafety.gov.au


#### BE RESPONSIBLE

- Consider using inbuilt filters and controls on your digital devices and home network to manage your children's online access. Keep your virus protection up to date
- Talk with your child about being careful when downloading files or clicking on links. Some files or links may be harmful viruses or trying to obtain personal information
- Cortain online activities (downloading flegal videos or music, plaglarism, sexting, identity theft, 'hacking' networks) are illegal and can result in criminal charges


