Whole school strategies to support social skills and to try something different.

Across the school we have been focussing on social skills development to help improve friendships, connection and inclusion, whilst K-2 have been running for some time 3-6 is gathering steam. I am lucky enough to work with different groups of students for a brief period of time each week with the support of a teacher aide and leadership - the teachers are then reinforcing the skills during the day with each student as they feed into our **PBS4L framework**.

The types of skills we are exploring with kids are all about **'Doing something different and making it work''.**

In Kindergarten this includes looking at someone's eyes and face to tell what they are feeling as well as seeing someone on the **Buddy Bench** and "doing something about it".

In Year 1 and Year 2 - using eye contact and active listening to tell when it is our turn and to **STOP and THINK about what we do** next and to make sure our behaviours are "above the line".







In Year 3- the focus is on **teaching and learning a skill** - currently this is about Chess - we are working out how to read the other person's strategy and thinking style - some people are outside

thinkers and others are internal thinkers - we are working on managing each other's style so the game is successful for both players.

In Year 4 - the focus is on **being good sports** - accepting success and disappointment and being active in supporting each other and building each other up.

In Year 5 and Year 6 the focus is **active bystanders** - what each student can do to support each other to have success - when they see someone struggling, or hear a rumour how they can **actively** intervene and change the outcome. Being active bystanders means **standing up for their beliefs** and asking for help if it is too much for them. This means asking at school and at home - if adults know about it we can support their choice for change.

Ms Howell was quoted:

"St Joseph's Primary School in Kingswood have lifted their literacy results in NAPLAN thanks to dedicated instructional leaders, funded by the NSW Government's Literacy and Numeracy Action Plan. The school has had instructional teachers for the past two and a half years and over that time there has been a decrease in the number of vulnerable students in literacy and numeracy."

"We have had proven success, our improvement in our NAPLAN results and our other assessment data results over the last few years have proven that the model has worked," the school's assistant principal Lisa Howell said.

In addition, the school is bolstering literacy by promoting "reading stamina" this year. "We are really focusing on students being able to maintain reading for longer periods of time. As part of the program Kindergarten to Year 6 students are encouraged to read every day and children's authors visit the school."
