Dear Parents and Carers,

Next week, we celebrate two important Catholic feasts for our parish and school.

Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> August, is the Feast of St Dominic, the founder of the "Order of Preachers" which dates back to 1216. Our parish priests, Fr Andrew OP and Fr Pawel OP belong to the Dominican Order as does Bishop Anthony Fisher OP.

Friday 8<sup>th</sup> August, is the Feast of St Mary of the Cross Mackillop, our first Australian Saint who founded the Religious Congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart. Our school was founded by these Sisters in 1963, after St Joseph's in Penrith was relocated and renamed St Nicholas of Myra. The Sisters of St Joseph were very active in our area. Mary Mackillop herself established OLOR School, St Mary's in 1880.

Both St Dominic and St Mary Mackillop led a deeply spiritual life and were devoted to the praying of the Rosary. St Dominic is attributed with spreading this Marian devotion through his preaching.

Pope Pius XI stated that: *"The Rosary of Mary is the principle and foundation on which the very Order of Saint Dominic rests for making perfect the life of its members and obtaining the salvation of others."*<sup>144</sup>

The habit worn by the Sisters of St Joseph included large rosary beads secured at the waist, symbolic of the importance of this prayer in their daily life. It was not unusual for the sisters to "say a decade" while working or walking during their day.

The Rosary meditates on the important events of the life of Jesus and acknowledges Mary's role as mother of Jesus and Help of Christians. The Rosary is a meditative prayer, inviting us to "sit with" the mystery of Christ. Try saying a decade in a spare moment while waiting or sitting in the car. It helps to put the ups and downs of life in perspective.

"Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen"

We are especially proud of her involvement in our school, as the Sisters of St Joseph founded St Joseph's Primary in 1963 and were a presence in the school until 1981.



We also acknowledge the feast of St Dominic on the 7<sup>th</sup> of August. Our Parish Priest, Father Andrew and his assistant Father Paul are both Dominicans as is our Bishop, Anthony. The Dominican order are renowned for their dedication to education, St Dominic was famous for his desire that everybody should learn to read so that eventually they could read the holy scriptures. Their motto is "To praise, to bless to preach" which is why he is often shown reading the bible in early art works.

Sunday the 10<sup>th</sup> of August we will also be holding a belated celebration of the feasts of St Joachim and Anne the Grandparents of Jesus. We will be combining this with our Family Fun Day to be held after the Mass.

As Year 4 become more confident using their iPads to support their learning, the question of “Where to next?” arises. The iLean Project provided Year 4 students with the iPad they will use through to Year 6. How can we provide 2015 Year 4 & 6’s with the same opportunity?

While the school will always provide a core number of iPads for each class, it is not financially viable to fund a 1:1 program. The alternative, which a number of primary schools and most secondary schools have adopted, is “bring your own device” (BYOD).

There are many issues that need to be considered before we go down that path, and we invite all parents to attend the Parent Association Meeting where this topic will be discussed. Once a decision is made, it will impact on all students as they progress through the school, so make your voice heard, bring your questions, as a BYOD program is only successful when parents and the school work in partnership. If you are unable to attend, please feel free to send in your thoughts for consideration.


