Tuesday the 4th of August...A wonderfully exciting day for St Joseph's...AARON BLABEY day! Our teachers have been working towards this day and preparing our students for more than six months. The level of excitement was amazing. At the beginning of the day, the entire school gathered in the MPA to greet Aaron. Mrs. Carter and some Year 5 students prepared an iMovie with students discussing their favourite books and characters. The Year 6 drama ensemble presented 'Noah Dreary' – one of Aaron's books. They received a standing ovation from Aaron for their amazing performance. Staff members were well into the spirit of the day, all dressing up as characters from Aaron's books.

Religious Literacy Assessment

In the gifts of bread and wine which are changed into the body and blood of Christ

Parents, you may like to go through these questions and answers with your children at home and have a discussion around what happens in each part of the Mass.



Open investigations are a fun way to learn numerous solutions and answers for a task. For example you may find 10 or more different answers for the same task.


How many solutions can you and your family come up with? Perhaps children could verse parents or work in teams...

Cancer Council NSW Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

...to make Apple + Peach Pie.

Ingredients
2 medium apples, peeled and chopped -- 800g can peaches canned in juice, drained-- 6 sheets filo pastry -- spray oil --1 teaspoon sugar

Method
Preheat oven to 200°C -- Place apples in a microwave and oven proof dish and cover with a plate or cling film with holes in it. Microwave on HIGH (100%) for 1 minute. Carefully remove the plate or cling-film as the steam will be hot -- Add peaches to the oven-proof dish. Scrunch a sheet of filo pastry and arrange on top of the dish. Repeat with the rest of the filo sheets until the whole top of the dish is covered -- Lightly spray the pastry with oil, and sprinkle with sugar -- Bake for 25 minutes, until the pastry is golden and crispy -- *TIP: This recipe works for any fresh, frozen or canned fruit.*
