So many of the fallen soldiers were aged in their late teens and early twenties. What horrors they must have faced.

We celebrated Mass inside the Memorial pylon and laid a wreath in honour of all who died fighting for a free world.



My heartfelt thanks to Ms Nicholls for leading our school community while I was on leave. Thank you also to the leadership team, Mr Aggar, Miss Treble, Mrs Berg and Mrs Aggarwal for their leadership and the staff for their support to ensure student learning is the priority of our school.
