Dear Parents and Carers,

Last Thursday, I attended the Principals' Retreat at Benedict XVI Retreat Centre, Grose Vale. Our guest speaker was Sherry Weddell from the USA. Sherry has been travelling the world, encouraging Catholics to be more open about their faith, to not be embarrassed about naming God, to say the name of Jesus confidently.

What do we understand about being Christian, a follower of Christ? It's more than "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." Mat 22:39. Loving "your neighbour" is a direct flow-on from "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." Christ showed compassion and love to others as a sign of God's love for them; to make God's kingdom real in our world. It's not WHAT we do but WHY we do it that changes an ordinary action into an encounter with God.

In Athens, there is a large marble outcrop, overlooking Athens, below the Acropolis, called the Areopagus. It was here that St Paul was brought before the councillors to account for his "babbling about Resurrection." St Paul was as zealous in his proclaiming the Gospel as he was in persecuting Christians before his conversion.

Paul addressed all those gathered: "Athenians.....as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you." (Acts 17:22-23)

Paul proclaimed the God revealed through Jesus Christ, "In him we live and move and have our being." Paul proclaimed an all-encompassing, Trinitarian God who created, redeemed and continues to sanctify our world. What do we know about this Christian God? Are we his disciples, willing to share his good news with others? It's a challenge for us all.

If you have any clean, pre loved uniforms that are no longer needed please feel free to drop them into the front office so we can add them to our 2nd Hand Uniform Shop.



Empty Number Lines


The empty number line is a line with no numbers and is a visual representation for recording thinking strategies during the mental computation process. Many opportunities to use empty number lines to solve problems increases children's confidence in their ability and leads easily towards mental calculations without paper.

The empty number line allows students to see the variety of ways that the same question can be solved. For example, to solve $157 + 36$ one student may begin at 157, add 30, then 6 while another may start at 157 and break the 36 into 3 and 33. This turns the question into the problem of adding 33 to 160.




Using the empty number line to solve word problems

Subtraction: I need \$72 to buy a skateboard. I have \$39. How many more \$ do I need to save?



39 is placed near the start of the empty number line and 72 near the end. We can count up in 'friendly' jumps to reach 72. First a jump of 1 to reach 40 (multiples of ten are easy numbers to jump to and from), then a jump of 30 to reach 70 and finally a jump of 2 to reach our target of 72. I need to save \$33.

Addition: A sunflower is 47 cm tall. It grows another 25cm. How tall is it?



Challenge: Design an interesting addition or subtraction word problem with your family and illustrate how you used an empty number line to solve it on paper.
