

Our School Formation goal:

Students will increase their knowledge and understanding of Christian Life as fostered by St Joseph and St Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

As a way of achieving this goal we are beginning to introduce The Three Senses of Scripture. It is a way to unpack scripture and delve deeper into its meaning and purpose. Ultimately scripture is inviting us to respond to this new learning which will be evident in our thoughts, words and actions.



Prayer ~ words ~ thoughts ~ actions

1. Literal Sense. To understand the Literal Sense we need to understand the information presented 'on the page'. We need to be successful in locating the following information.

2. Spiritual Sense. To understand the Spiritual Sense of a piece of scripture we need to see between the lines and discern a deeper meaning and make connections with Catholic teaching, practice and tradition.

3. Application. The Application Sense is pondering how the Literal and Spiritual Sense applies to your life. What does the Scripture call me to and to reflect on ways that I will love God and my neighbour today and in the weeks ahead.

After reading the Scripture story as a family think of the following questions: WHERE IS GOD REVEALED IN THE SCRIPTURE? (SPIRITUAL SENSE) HOW CAN YOU USE YOUR AWARENESS OF GOD'S PRESENCE IN YOUR LIFE? (APPLICATION SENSE)



Counsellor's Corner

PBS4L - Helping your child have success on Joey's Journey at SJK

All the students at St Joseph's have enjoyed various Joey Jump celebrations and awards for being Safe and Respectful Learners. Here are a few tips that you might be able to use to help your child succeed on Joey's Journey.

Ask your child to share:

- 1. When they showed safety and respect during the day?
- 2. Which piece of learning they enjoyed the most?
- 3. How many Joey's did they receive for being on Joey's journey?

Big Feelings - Helping your child name and manage some of the feelings from school

At St Joseph's we use the language of "How to fix things including - Big Feelings" to acknowledge our students reactions to situations - sometimes it can be -

- "super-excitement" of winning the Attendance Award or a Joey Jump celebration
- "Sad feelings" around the outcome of a game or being first to line up
- "Disappointment" around friendships

We try not to pick the feeling, for example instead of saying "When you were walking away from your friends you looked really angry", staff practice emotion coaching - "I can see there are some big feelings, we can talk about what happened with your friends, so we can fix it and get back into play/learning" - older students will name "yes I feel really annoyed/angry etc..", however younger students need more prompts and older students need some guidance to explore the feelings they name.

At home when your child expresses feelings about a situation at school it would build their emotional language and ability to problem solve if you could try asking the following questions:

- 1. "It must be really hard to have these feelings"
- 2. "Thank you for being honest with me"
- 3. "How did you work with the teacher to fix the problem?"
- 4. "How can we help let go of the day and enjoy our home time?"

Your children are amazing at coming up with solutions when they have calmed their big feelings, I am sure you will be proud of the types of things they share with you.
