Photo Permission

Child Protection

If parents are planning on assisting in the classroom, or on an excursion, they are required to first complete Child Protection Training. The training is undertaken over the internet at

Simply click the training link under "Volunteer" to undertake the training.

This needs to be renewed every 2 years.

Nut Allergies

As you may be aware there are a number of children attending our school who have nut allergies. This means that if these children come in contact with any nut products they will have a severe allergic reaction. We are asking that children refrain from bringing food to school that may contain nuts. (Nutella, Peanut Butter, Muesli bars etc.) We also ask that you remind your child/ren not share their lunch or any other food with another child.

School Opal Card

An important requirement of School Opal is the need for students to Tap On and Tap Off when they travel to and from school.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services.

If students don't Tap on and Tap off, services may be cancelled or reduced due to the lack of recorded patronage. With this in mind, please remind your child that tapping on and off at the beginning and end of each trip is one of the conditions of using an School Opal card. This in turn helps Busways ensure they are able to provide the appropriate level of service to the school.

Panama - World Youth Day 2019









Over the past three weeks, I had the privilege of going on a pilgrimage with 170 young people from our diocese to attend World Youth Day in Panama. We were led by Bishop Vincent Long and Greg Whitby, the Executive Director of Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Parramatta.

World Youth Day is open to all young people and is a unique way to deepen your faith and grow closer to Christ. It was initiated by Saint Pope John Paul II in 1985 and is typically celebrated every three years in a different country. In 2008, it was celebrated in Sydney!

The Church of Our Lady of Remedies

Prior to spending a week in Panama for World Youth Day, our Parramatta group went to Mexico, including Mexico City and Puebla. We visited grand churches and basilicas, including the Church of Our Lady of Remedies, atop the largest pyramid in the world, and the Church of Santo Domingo. We experienced a festival hosted by the local Diocese in Puebla and visited the Pyramids of the Sun and Moon, climbing to the top of the Pyramid of the Sun!



We made it!



Our trip to Mexico culminated in a visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. This shrine is one of the most visited in the world, with 12 million visitors a year. The shrine is in dedication to Our Lady who appeared to Saint Juan Diego, an indigenous Mexican farmer. She appeared to him four times and on the last time, she arranged flowers in a tilma (a simple cloak) for him to show the Bishop at the time who did not believe the apparitions. This tilma and the original image are on display in the Basilica.

World Youth Day Week in Panama was a spiritually enlightening experience. We prayed together, celebrated Mass together, and shared our experiences of faith together. During the week, our patience was tested as we experienced crowds that even surprised the WYD organisers! My highlights of the week included the official Papal arrival in which we were

metres away from the popernobile as he moved past, reflecting with Pope Francis on the Stations of the Cross, learning about the power of adoration to the Blessed Sacrament and finally celebrating mass with Pope Francis and hundreds of thousands of other young people from around the world.



In his homily at the Final Mass, Pope Francis challenged us to be inconvenienced by God as he is not a distant God, but concrete and familiar. "God is real because love is real." He then called young people to gather in communities and stand together to "realise the dream that the Lord has dreamed for you." He said that young people "are not the future but the now of God."
