I am ready to do my work




We look forward to one day welcoming all the students back to school where we can continue to be on **Joey's Journey of being Safe, Respectful Learners** together.

Tips for families on how to use Joeys at HOME



- When your child is doing their learning and meeting the expectations they can earn a Joey
 - The expectations are:
 - Be in the Right Place at the Right Time doing the Right Thing
 - Be safe with our words and actions
 - Be respectful with our words and actions
 - Having a go with the task
 - Doing hard thinking saying "I can do this"
- When your child earns 5 Joeys you can have a reward time of a few minutes maybe running in the back yard or doing a quick drawing or game
- When your child gets 10 Joeys you can provide a bigger reward maybe 10 minutes of play or an activity
- Your child can share this great news with their teacher


Attendance


