

Counsellor's Corner

As we finish our FIRST 10 week term of the year we are finding there is a level of tiredness spreading through the grades, we have focussed on the use of Kind Words to help solve problems and whilst everyone is trying we could use your support at home to help with this. So, when your child comes home and reports problems from the playground or in class we ask that you try and:

- 1. Listen supportively without commenting
- 2. Ask about how they felt at the time
- 3. Ask who helped them and if they reported it when it happened
- 4. Did they feel things settled down?
- 5. What is one thing they could do to have a better day tomorrow?

We aim to encourage all students to be Safe Respectful Learners and we encourage children to problem solve using KIND WORDS in the following ways:

- 1. Use an "I" statement to identify the person and the thing you want to stop " Miss Goode, I feel sad when you say mean words to me..."
- 2. Ask for the behaviour to stop, this can be through words ("Stop saying or doing") or actions (move away)
- 3. Ask for help talking with the closest teacher to get adult support is reporting **not** dobbing and it is because the other strategies have not changed the situation
- 4. Class Teacher follow-up the class teacher can spend time with both children to acknowledge the big feelings and plan for success

Sometimes children won't feel this has eased the issues and will go home and use some form of social media to give feedback or continue on with the situation. School's are unable to control this and implement consequences if it is reported; however if we are advised of the worry we can provide support to the children by reviewing the issues from the previous day and offer support to both parties.

To get holistic feedback from your child about their day you could ask about:

- 1. Successes of the day
- 2. Struggles in the day
- 3. How they were celebrated or managed
- 4. Are there any ongoing worries about any struggles and any ideas about how they can be supported at home to keep it off social media you can encourage your child to try any of the following:
- use water as a calming tool
- Write a letter (no one else needs to read it)
- Go for a walk or play a game
- Feel free to contact your child's class teacher

Reminders



We have several students who are anaphylactic. Thanks for helping to keep everyone safe.

Please remember to ensure your child has a drink bottle every day, filled with water, as our students do not have access to the bubblers at school. They do have access to taps to refill their bottles during the day.

We certainly have enjoyed an action packed and fun filled term of wonderful learning at St Joseph's and our school Facebook page has captured all of these events for you. The children have really let their light shine as they have performed dances they learnt during their Captivate dance lessons, shared powerful Voice of Youth Speeches, participated in maths problem solving days during our Maths Mayhem day, dived deeply into their Science project based learning units and focused on enhancing their creative writing skills as part of our upcoming Writer's Festival.

It has been beautiful to witness how all the children have encouraged and supported each other by celebrating their gifts and talents. Seeing the delight expressed on our students' faces as they have been recognised for their learning in the classrooms has been an indication that despite all that they have been presented with over the last six months, our students really are very resilient and adaptive.

Throughout the term we have been blessed to have a number of Teacher Educators, in the area of Literacy, Numeracy and RE, who have not only been working with our students but also with our teachers to continue to develop challenging learning programs that support and extend our student's learning. Teacher Educators have an important role in our diocese to support the learning and teaching within a school. They partner with the teachers in each school to specially focus on building capacity and ensuring our students are continuing to build upon their learning each and every day.

School Leavers

We are planning for the 2021 school year and to help us with this please let the office know if your family will not be continuing at St Joseph's in 2021 (no need for Year 6).



A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a **full term's fees will be payable**. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment ie the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

Outstanding School Fees


