Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome back to Term 3! We are all looking forward to an exciting and focused term with lots of learning.

Learning is the priority here at St. Joseph's - we're learning all of the time. We're learning about how to read and write, how to be Mathematicians, how to find out more about God and many more things. We're also learning how to be wonderful little people who can work and play with others in a calm, respectful and joyful way.

We have many ways that this particular learning happens at St Joseph's:

- In classrooms every day teachers are modelling, teaching and reminding children about the expectations of our PBS4L framework how to be Safe, Respectful Learners
- During Lunch 2 on the Infants' playground Ms Goode has set up an exciting play area where children can voluntarily come along and play together with BeyBlades, cars, puzzles and other toys. Ms Goode and some helpers are guiding, supporting, reinforcing and praising children as they learn to answer politely, share toys, take turns and play together.
- Lunchtime clubs Many lunchtimes teachers run interest clubs for children. There are a variety of clubs that focus on fun but are also opportunities for children to learn how to learn and cooperate together.
- Social Skills Groups These groups look very different across the school. Classroom teachers and Ms. Goode collaborate and create social skills groups that will support children to develop these skills. Sometimes children are working in small groups of 4 and others in a much larger group which includes the entire class. Our goal is to ensure every child has this opportunity.

Encourage your child to develop their social skills at home as well. Taking turns, waiting patiently, polite words, sharing are all important skills your child needs to learn to be able to be successful in life.

### **Counsellor's Corner**

#### **Showing Respect**

Welcome to Term 3 it is important we all support the children in showing respect to each other in their friendships and with teachers in their learning and of course at home. Being Respectful is a key value during learning time and at play, we encourage respect in the way we talk to each other and share space with each other. We encourage all children to report concerns around behaviour that is leading to upset, this includes verbal and physical behaviour - with the view that asking for help shares the responsibility and allows teachers - in class and on duty the opportunity to respond to the concerns and to provide support.



To help model respect and to show support for each other, we encourage students to use kind words and in fact to be the "I" in KIND, showing friendship means in words and actions - including others and joining in play respectfully. To teachers and adults it means responding when they are called, answering the questions and working together to solve problems.



TTFM can provide a basis to inform school improvement, taking into account key drivers of student outcomes and applying them to the unique context of an individual school. Data is refreshed and generated with each new survey.

TTFM is a survey instrument administered by The Learning Bar. The Learning Bar's stated aim is to improve student outcomes and reduce childhood vulnerability. The organisation develops survey solutions and works with organisations to conduct surveys internationally.
