Counsellor's Corner

Big Feelings - Helping your child name and manage some of the feelings from school

At St Joseph's we use the language of "How to fix things including - Big Feelings" to acknowledge our students reactions to situations - sometimes it can be -

- "super-excitement" of winning the Attendance Award or a Joey Jump celebration
- "Sad feelings" around the outcome of a game or not being first to line up
- "Disappointment" around friendships
- Anger at not being heard or missing out

We try not to pick or name the feeling, for example instead of saying "When you were walking away from your friends you looked really angry", staff practice **emotion coaching** - "I can see there are **some big feelings"**, "I am sorry things are so hard right now", "lets see how we can fix it and get back into play/learning" - older students will name "yes I feel really annoyed/angry etc..", however younger students need more prompts and older students need some guidance to explore the feelings they name.

At home when your child expresses feelings about a situation at school it would build their emotional language and ability to problem solve if you could try asking the following questions:

- 1. "It must be really hard to have these feelings"
- 2. "Thank you for being honest with me"
- 3. "How did you work with the teacher to fix the problem?"
- 4. "How can we help let go of the day and enjoy our home time?"

Your children are amazing at coming up with solutions when they have calmed their big feelings, I am sure you will be proud of the types of things they share with you.

Practicing dealing with big feelings and finding ways to use our words helps everyone solve problems in a safe and respectful way.

School Fees

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta have not been following up outstanding school fees the usual way. Reminder letters have not been sent out and families have been asked to pay what they can, when they can afford to make the payment.

Leaving St Joseph's



A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a pro-rata 40 week year.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

If you know your child will be leaving St Joseph's at the end of the year, please advise the school as soon as possible.

School Travel 2021

School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>re-apply or update their details</u>.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new <u>eligibility criteria</u>, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
 Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.
