Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Friends,

"We are currently preparing our students for jobs that don't exist, using technologies that haven't been invented, in order to solve problems we don't even know are problems yet."-Karl Fisch-



What a huge responsibility our teachers have in educating your children for an unknown future! At St. Joseph's, we are trying



very hard to set your children (our students) up for success. Our current Kindergarten students will finish their High School education in October 2034. We are ensuring our students have the key skills and competencies to undertake any work challenge in 2035 when they start their tertiary education or enter the workforce. They need to be creative problem solvers, collaborative and articulate team members that can think critically about the issues being presented. This is the world we

are living in. This is not the future; this is what is happening right now.

Currently NSW is going through a major curriculum reform where the aim is to build strong foundations in the early years, focus on deep learning, strengthening post schooling pathways and is accessible and inclusive for all students. St Joseph's is one of four primary schools in the diocese that will be trialling the new K-2 English and Maths Syllabus this term prior to full implementation later this year.

The government has allocated additional funding to many schools across Australia to counteract the effects of COVID19 restrictions in 2021. St. Joseph's has been blessed to receive some funding and we have employed an additional experienced teacher to provide small group intensive lessons to students in Years 3-6. Mrs Kate Bentham comes to



us as an experienced teacher in providing intervention and additional learning support in schools within the Sydney Diocese and we are excited to have her join our community.

On Thursday 17th February, the NSW Government relaxed a number of Covid-19 restrictions. Importantly, at this time, mask wearing for staff and visitors to the school remains in place. Also in the coming week we will receive a third delivery of Rapid Antigen Test (RATs). These will be sent home as soon as they arrive at school.

Starting next week our Year Five & Year Six students will receive a visit from the Principals of Caroline Chisholm and St Dominics as well as Xavier and Penola College. These visits are to promote our feeder high schools in the diocese and for students to ask questions to support their transition to high school next year.

Catholic Schools week begins on the 6th March and as part of this week of celebration we will be holding two open days to promote and share with prospective families the wonderful learning spaces and what we offer here at St Joseph's. The first day is Tuesday 8th March at 4:00 pm and the second on Thursday 10th March at 5:00 pm. We ask that visitors please wear a mask when attending.

Staff Development Day - Friday 25th March - On Friday 25th March the staff at St Joseph's will be involved in a staff development day with a focus on religious education and spiritual formation. This will mean the school will be closed and it will be a pupil free day for students. If you require care for your child please contact Jacki at Joeys on 4732 5771.

Counsellor's Corner

As part of the process of supporting year 6 as they prepare to finish their primary years and get ready for their high school journey, it is with great excitement that Mrs Helleur and Miss Goode will be meeting briefly with Year 6 students to gain an idea of:

- How they are feeling about being in year 6 with the view to developing their "Words of Wisdom" for the 2023 leaders it is early but why not!!
- What are their hopes and what worries them about all the changes the year brings
- What strategies could build their happiness as they end their time on Joey's Journey
- What strategies could support them transitioning to high school

As well as asking about their likes and dislikes to help us develop strategies to use with the teachers and the whole class to build their confidence and resilience as leaders of 2022.

Tips for you to help build social skills with your children:

In light of returning to school after a long break and a broken up year we were thinking about some basics to help children reconnect with their friends and teacher's - we are hoping these few points will support their ongoing success at returning to school.

- 1. Encourage your child to look at your face when they hear their name "I love seeing your eyes, I know you are listening"
- 2. Try and learn the names of some children in your child's class and ask about what games they like to play "Did you play with......what was your favourite game?"
- Look into play dates so they can practice taking turns, asking questions and HAVING FUN if time is an
 issue you can play together to practice these same skills Guess Who, connect 4, UNO all help with
 building social skills and fair player skills
- 4. Also a family games night where you can model the skills above as well as good winning and gracious losing you are their best teachers!!

School Student Travel

School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to apply or update their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

New Student Opal cards (including new Term Bus Passes) will be sent to the student's nominated postal address within two weeks of their application being approved.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.

Attendance

I'd like to congratulate the week 3 winners of the Attendance Trophy for 'Being the best at beating the bell every morning': Primary - Year 6; Infants - Kindergarten.

I'd also like to thank you, the parents and carers for getting your children to school before the bell! It's so important to have your children arrive before 8:50am. This helps set them up for a calm and settled day. School supervision starts at 8:20am.

At 8:50am the class roll is taken, followed by the outline of the day. By 9am their learning has begun. Please note traffic conditions are not going to change anytime soon...you may need to leave home 10 minutes earlier each morning to allow for traffic.

If you are having trouble organising your child to get to school on time, please contact the office to arrange an appointment with their class teacher or myself. We are more than happy to help.

If your child is absent on any given day please contact the school via phone, Skoolbag or email.

Leaving St Joseph's



A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term

Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a 40 week year.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

Safety around SJK

Kiss n Ride

Just a reminder to all families that you must not park or exit your vehicle in the Kiss n Ride zone when dropping off or picking up your child in the morning or afternoon. Our school is extremely fortunate to offer this service to our families, however, to ensure the safety of all students, families and teachers we ask all parents to ensure you are following our Kiss n Ride/Drop procedures as outlined below:

In Joseph Street a place has been designated for Kiss 'n' Ride - an area where children may be dropped off before school, or picked up after school. Kiss 'n' Ride is a "**No Parking**" and "**No Standing**" **Area.** To assist with traffic flow, drivers <u>must remain</u> in the car whilst children get in and out. Children should travel with bags in the car (not in the boot).

Kiss 'n' Ride bays are labelled 1, 2, 3 and 4. Please move to the furthermost number as directed by the teacher on duty. Please ensure you have a sign in your windscreen with your child(ren)'s name written in large, black writing to assist teachers with identifying your vehicle. Contact the school office if you would like one made for you.

Students that are waiting to be collected from Kiss 'n' Ride are supervised by teachers until 3.30pm. Children not collected by 3.30pm are taken to the school office or to Joey's After School Care. Parents will be contacted. No child is left unsupervised. If you are unable to collect your child(ren) before 3.30pm, please contact Joey's Before and After School Care and organise regular extended care.

Wet weather - if raining or looks like rain, Kiss 'n' Ride will be closed. Children are to be collected from the building to the left of the Administration block or from the Stage 2 building near the netball court. A notification on Skoolbag at approximately 2.30pm will inform parents about this closure.

Please refer to the Roads and Maritime Services NSW website for more details on rules surrounding Kiss 'n' Ride zones as they are frequently patrolled by the authorities and you may receive a fine and/or loss of demerit points if you do not comply with all rules.
