Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Friends,

As we come to the 3rd Sunday of Lent it was heartening to see the support in gold coin donations from students for local families and those affected from the floods across NSW as we came together to celebrate St Patrick's Day.



By giving what we can we make the needs of others our own. We become the compassionate people Jesus calls us to be.

This Saturday is the Feast Day of St Joseph, the Patron Saint of our school. Next Thursday 24th March we will be celebrating this day as a whole school community with morning activities in class learning about the wonderful traits of Joseph, followed by fun sport activities led by Motiv8sports, picnic lunch with parents and carers and culminating in a whole school liturgy in the afternoon. More information about this celebration will be shared with families soon on Facebook and Skoolbag.

On the following <u>Friday 25th March the school will be closed</u> for the day as the whole school staff will be participating in a Faith Formation Staff Development Day off site. The office will also be closed and parents and carers will need to make alternative arrangements for care if children cannot be supervised at home.

Providing a safe and secure environment at school is a priority here for us at St Joseph's. It is important that when children are dropped off in the morning that parents preferably park on the same side as the school and assist their children to exit the car safely and walk through the school gates. If parking on the opposite side of the school, it is necessary for parents to park their vehicle and assist their child to cross at the pedestrian crossing in front of the school. I have noticed some families leaving students and driving off before checking to see if they have crossed the road safely and entered the school grounds. Please help to make school drop off safe for everyone.

Today is the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence and next Monday is Harmony Day. The National Day against Bullying is a day to learn what bullying is and isn't, as well as learning ways to deal with difficult situations. Harmony Day is a national celebration of inclusiveness, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of cultural or linguistic background.

Ride 2 School Day

National Ride 2 School Day will held this year on March 25th. However, as this is a Staff Development Day, we at St Joseph's are holding our Ride to School Day the following week on **Friday April 1st.**

What is Ride to School Day? Ride2School is a nationwide program facilitated through Bicycle Network, designed to support schools to encourage, empower and enable more students (and teachers) to get physically active on their journey to school.

Who can be involved? Any child aged 10 or older who has a safe, working bike and an approved bicycle helmet. No scooters, skateboards or roller-skates

What to do? Children are encouraged to ride their bikes *from home to school*. Some time will be set aside during the school day where students will be able to participate in a variety of fun and challenging activities on their bikes.

As we come closer the end of term and my time at St Joseph's I thought it was a good time to think about one of our values that help us to be Safe and Respectful Learners and that is -

Being the "I" in KIND

Kindness feels good, being nice promotes happiness - these elements at school will help our children have success on Joey's Journey.

Here are some tips:

- **Brighten someone's day.** Model a warm "hello" that kids can repeat when they greet their caregiver, playmates, or teacher each morning.
- **Remember others.** Help kids call, email, Skype, or FaceTime grandma and grandpa.
- **Inspire giving.** Set aside canned goods, cookies, juice, and cereal. Take your kids along when you deliver items to the local food bank.
- **Embrace gratitude.** Remind kids to put the sitter, the librarian, or the parent in charge of carpool onto their I-need-to-thank-them list.
- **Reward efforts.** Dole out a thank you and a warm hug when kids pick up toys or books they weren't responsible for dropping.

Leaving St Joseph's



A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term.

Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a 40 week year.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.
