Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Friends,

The last three weeks have been extremely busy at St.
Joseph's with Semester Reports and Student Led
Conferences demonstrating ways in which we have
been able to work together as a team – students,
teachers, and parents. Thank you to the many parents
who speak so positively about our school, the programs delivered by the
teachers and the care that the staff take of the children each and every
day.

This term, I have been interviewing families who are seeking enrolment for Kindergarten in 2023. The families have spoken about the fine reputation our school holds in the community as well as the recommendations that our current and past families have given them about St. Joseph's being a nurturing community. As we approach the midpoint of the year and with the holidays just around the corner, I thought I would share some thoughts about using these holidays well. Australian families are increasingly time-strapped. The busy-ness of life can make it difficult for adults and children to participate in enjoyable activities or to just 'hang out' as a family.

Do you engage regularly in activities that involve play and laughter or are all your interactions with children of a managerial nature? School holidays offer families a chance to unwind away from the normal routines. They also provide a window of opportunity for parents to spend some enjoyable time with children. There are many theories about promoting healthy parent-child relationships and strengthening families. It is, however, easy to overlook a simple, cheap way of forming family relationships – spending enjoyable time together.

American family researcher John DeFrain has found that the happiest childhood memories that adults hold have two common threads. First, childhood happiness always centres on activities experienced together as a family. Second, the most pleasurable childhood times almost always centre on simple, inexpensive activities. During the holidays do something fun and enjoyable with your children. It doesn't have to be expensive, but it should be something different, something fun and something that involves laughter and play. Money can't buy happiness, but loving family relationships can create it.

So, as we finish Term 2, may I extend my thanks to our dedicated staff for their work this term, to the students who have worked hard and achieved great successes in their learning and to you, the parents for your ongoing support and trust you have in us as experienced educators.



The stage 3 students will also highlight the importance of our Catholic values being acted out in our everyday lives. Counsellor's Corner

It can be hard to find things to keep kids entertained during the holidays - and many kids will want as much screen time as possible! Try to keep your routines consistent so the transition back to school next term goes smoothly.

One idea to keep the kids entertained (and away from screens) is to have a family games day. Each person gets to pick a game for everyone to play. These can be board games, sports races, challenges, anything you can think of or have on hand. Set up a tournament together working your way through each game at a time. Games are a great way to help your child develop skills in communication, turn taking, sharing and coping when things don't always go the way you want.

Try a fun "Would you Rather" conversation starter. Roll a dice and then answer the question for the number you roll:

- 1. Would you rather be able to fly or be invisible?
- 2. Would you rather have a pet panda or zebra?
- 3. Would you rather discover a hidden treasure or a living dinosaur?
- 4. Would you rather eat spinach ice cream or a broccoli milkshake?
- 5. Would you rather pat a spider or a cockroach?
- 6. Would you rather moo like a cow or bark like a dog to speak?



This game can also be used to help kids develop their friendship skills. Roll the dice and answer the question for the number rolled:

- 1. What makes a good friend?
- 2. How would a good friend make you feel about yourself?3. Is it better to have a fun friend, or a kind friend?
- 4. What could you say to a friend who looks sad?
- 5. What would you say to a friend who looks worried?
- 6. Who do you trust to talk with about your feelings? What makes them special?

Covid Safe Protocols

All students, families and staff are requested to follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only transmitting COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect schools this winter such as the flu.

Parents are required to:

- inform the school if their child tests COVID positive and keep the child at home in isolation for the required 7 days.
- inform the school if their child is a close household contact, administer a RAT daily before the child attends school and keep the child home if they are unwell or symptomatic.

Cashless Payments

We are no longer able to accept any cash at St Joseph's. The only option for making payments in the office is through Eftpos.

This year there will be a new payment system for things like gala days, fundraising and missions. Details of the new payment system with instructions will be sent out soon.

Leaving St Joseph's



A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term.

Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a 40 week year.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.
