Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Friends,



Next Tuesday we celebrate The Feast Day of Mary, Help of Christians in Australia. The feast day to Mary has been celebrated in Australia since 1844. The infant church in

Australia had a special reason for turning to Mary. No priests were sent to the colony in its early days and Mass was not allowed except for one brief year until 1820. It was largely the Rosary in those early days that kept the faith alive. Catholic Australia remained faithful to Mary and was the first nation to choose her under the title Help of Christians, as principal Patroness. St Mary's Cathedral was dedicated in her honour by the Irish pioneer priest, Fr John Therry, who arrived in Sydney in

1820 and assumed responsibility for the planning and initial construction of the Cathedral. Therefore, on this feast day, we thank our heavenly Father for Mary, who gives us the perfect model of love, understanding and compassion.

It was wonderful to see so many people attend the Mother's Day afternoon tea and liturgy. The children loved spending this time with the special person in their lives and celebrating all they have done and continue to do through our liturgy led by Kindergarten.

Next week we will be holding a Book Fair in the MPA each morning from 8:20-8:50am where parents are invited to purchase books for their child to help raise money for the school and to help their child/children grow as readers. The Book Fair aims to promote the value of reading and literacy. Please note payment for books is by Eftpos only. NO CASH will be accepted. On Wednesday morning



the students in all grades will participate in the National Simultaneous Read Aloud Initiative where at 11am across Australia students will listen to the picture book 'The Family Tree' by Australian author Josh Pike. In the afternoon the students will be entertained by a dramatisation by the teachers of one of their favourite Aaron Blabey stories.

Stop Work Action

Next Friday, 27th May a number of our staff may take part in a protected industrial action (stop work action) to progress their claims for a new enterprise agreement. At this stage it is not known how many staff members will participate. Supervision will be provided on the day, however, no classes will be held. Given this, we strongly encourage families not to send their children to school on this day given the potential reduction in staff.

Next week we will be moving to the Compass Parent Portal as our main way of communicating with parents. This will mean that the Skoolbag App will no longer be used to share Newsletters and school notes by the end of term. All schools across the Diocese are moving to this centralised platform for communication between school and home. A letter will soon be sent via email and notification via SMS to all enrolled families with your login details for Compass. It is most important to keep your Username and Password secure, just like your bank details and they should not be shared with anyone.

- Review your child's attendance
- Provide explanations for periods of absence
- Update your contact details
- View your child's Semester Reports

Safeguarding

Safeguarding In October 2021, the NSW Government passed legislation to embed the 10 Child Safe Standards into the Children's Guardian Act 2019. The passing of this legislation, recommended by the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse, will create safer environments and organisations for the children and young people of NSW. The 10 Child Safe Standards provide a framework for child-related organisations to create and maintain child-safe cultures, operations and environments. CEDP has already embedded the Standards into our policies and practices and is well placed for their implementation and compliance with the Act. This week please see the attached flyer about

Online Safety

Parents and carers play a key role in guiding their children as they first encounter the online world and begin to learn through exploration, play and social interaction.

At SJK we are aware that many primary students own or have access to a smartphone or iPad where they are online playing games with friends, connecting with others on various messaging platforms/apps and have social media accounts such as Tik Tok, Snapchat, Instagram, etc.

As children start to navigate the online world and interact with others more independently, they are more likely to be exposed to risks of bullying or unwanted contact,

Advice for parents and carers

- Keep the computer or device in an area of your home that can be supervised. And check in regularly with your child to see what they are viewing.
- Stay engaged with their online activity. If they agree, consider setting up your own accounts with the sites they use most so you can see how they work and understand the risks.
- Explore the online world with them to help establish that this is not just a solitary activity. Play games with them. Do a creative project together.
- Think about social media readiness. Most social media sites require users to be at least 13 years of age before they can register, although some sites are created especially for children under 13.
- Encourage respect and empathy. Teach them to avoid sharing or posting things that may upset others. Discuss and monitor comments your child is making on social media websites.
- Start building resilience. Teach your child that there are ways they can deal with material that worries or frightens them. This includes immediately telling you or another trusted adult of any concerns or uncomfortable material. Taking screenshots of negative, mean or bullying comments/content that may need to be reported to the Police.

STANDARD 1



Child safety is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture

Aim: Organisations prioritise child safety in what they say and do

Why is this Standard important?

Children are less likely to be exposed to abuse and harm when leadership is committed to providing safe environments.

Child safe values and practices guide the behaviour and attitudes of staff, creating a culture of child safety.

Leaders champion these values and embed them into organisational governance.

What should CEDP be doing?

- Make a public commitment to child safety.
- Leaders champion a child safe culture both within CEDP and the wider community.
- Child safety is a responsibility shared by all staff.
- Risk management focus on preventing, identifying and lowering risks to children.
- Staff understand and comply

with the behavioural standards when interacting with children set out in the Codes of Conduct.

 Staff understand the obligations in relation to reporting, sharing information and record-keeping.

A good child safe culture requires all staff to be leaders in child safety.

What We're Doing

Including, but not limited to:

- Child-friendly Safeguarding Commitment Statement available (via Oscar and CEDP website).
- Lines of authority and reporting available in the <u>Safeguarding Organisational Chart</u> (attached to the CEDP Safeguarding Procedures).
- · Mandatory annual Safeguarding training for all staff.
- Targeted Safeguarding training for identified roles.
- Safeguarding is considered in all school excursion Risk Assessments.
- A CEDP Safeguarding Risk Management Plan, reviewed quarterly, which includes strategies focusing on prevention, identification and mitigation of risks to children.
- Schools complete mandatory compliance programmes which incorporate the Safeguarding Standards.
- · Provision of Information Sharing Guidelines and strict record keeping processes for Safeguarding information.
- Use of the Safeguarding Case Management System to support CEDP's obligations for record keeping.
- · Safeguarding encouraged at school meetings and staff briefings.
- Safeguarding policies and procedures which include: <u>Safeguarding Procedures</u>, <u>Code of Conduct</u>, <u>Code of Conduct</u> When Working with Children and Students, Working With Children Check Policy, Responsible Use of ICT and Social Media (Students) Guidelines, Acceptable Use of ICT and Social Media for Staff.

Counsellor's Corner

This term the school counsellors are working on enhancing social play skills across a few of our grades. Your children might share with you some of the things they've been learning about and it is something that you can also work on at home with your children. The Genius of Play explains how we can help kids learn vital life skills such as communication, cooperation, problem-solving, and perspective taking.

"Learning the skills that children practice in social play takes lots of sensitive adult support because:

- Children often do not know what is expected in different social situations;
- They don't have the experience and knowledge of appropriate ways to solve conflicts;
- They are naturally self-centered, so it is hard for them to understand others' intentions and feelings.

Here's how you help:

Communication

- Teach appropriate ways of getting people's attention: "When you want Nikko's attention, say 'Nikko,' gently tap his shoulder, then wait for him to look at you."
- Help children tell each other directly what they want or need: "Tell Sharon, 'I want to pretend the that the baby is sick and needs to go to the doctor."
- Show them how to join in asking to play is not always the best strategy. Socially competent children often watch the children playing then find a way to ease into the ongoing play. "Look! They are building a road with blocks. Would you like to put some of these signs next to the roads?"

Cooperation

Explain what cooperation looks like in different play situations:

- Sharing: "Hold the book so Tim can see the pages." "Roll the ball to Rachel, then she can roll it to you."
- Taking turns: Help kids negotiate who goes first and the time for each turn.
- Compromising: Give children ideas about how each can get a little of what they want.

Problem-Solving

When children play together, conflicts are inevitable. Help kids learn to solve problems collaboratively by teaching them steps to negotiate:

- 1. State the problem everyone gets a say.
- 2. Brainstorm solutions again, everyone contributes.
- 3. Choose the solution that everyone agrees on.
- 4. Implement the solution decide on the logistics (length of turns, who goes first, etc.)
- 5. Evaluate the solution how is it working?

Perspective-Taking

We can help children understand the perspective of others by pointing out:

- How others feel: "Her face is saying 'I'm sad.""
- How your child's behaviour affects others: "When you insist on having your way, friends may not want to play with you."
- How other children might see things differently: "John may not like to be pulled that fast in the wagon."

With your support and many opportunities for social play, your children will develop the social skills they need to get along with others throughout their lives. And they will have lots of fun, too!"

HOW TO ORDER

OPTION 1 ORDER ONLINE NOW

Online payment options include Visa, Mastercard and PayPal. Alternatively, you can choose to pay over 10 weeks using LatitudePay.

STEP 1

Find your school's shared 9 digit community order code on the advancedlife order envelope.



STEP 2

Go to www.advancedlife.com.au on your computer, phone or tablet.

Enter your school's 9 digit order code in the 'order & download' box. This will take you to the secure online ordering site for your school.



STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and choose your package, then follow the payment process. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available.







OPTION 2 CASH/ENVELOPE ORDERING

Schools prefer orders placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on photo day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

If your school chooses to have sibling photographs, you can order online up until midnight the night before photo day. If you miss the midnight deadline, a sibling order envelope including cash payment can be handed directly to our photographers on the day. Please tell your school that your children are to be photographed. Only siblings attending the school are permitted to be photographed.

ONLINE ORDER RECEIPTS

An order receipt will be emailed to the email address you provide during the ordering process. Please note that orders placed via PayPal can take up to 48 hours for payment to be processed and a receipt sent.

ARE THERE FEES FOR ORDERING ONLINE

There are no fees for LatitudePay or envelope ordering. There is a 1.5% merchant fee applied when using Visa, Mastercard or PayPal. For more information go to:

If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.

SPORTS/EXTRA-CURRICULAR PHOTO

Once sports/extra-curricular photos have been taken, your school will forward you a link and a unique online order code that you can use to order sports/extracurricular photos online. A 20% discount is offered for all orders placed within the first 2 weeks. After the 2-week discount period, orders can still be placed online at the standard pricing.

If you prefer to personally collect your photographic package from the school office, rather than have it sent home with your child, please select the "Collect Your Pack" option when you order online.

If your child's image is "not for publication" and your school is aware of your decision, your child should not be presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. All students presented to our photographers by your school for a photo on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages and these packages will be available to purchase.

REFUND POLICY

Covid Safe Protocols

All students, families and staff are requested to follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only transmitting COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect schools this winter such as the flu.

- inform the school if their child tests COVID positive and keep the child at home in isolation for the required 7 days.
- inform the school if their child is a close household contact, administer a RAT daily before the child attends school and keep the child home if they are unwell or symptomatic.

Cashless Payments

NO MORE CASH ACCEPTED

We are no longer able to accept any cash at St Joseph's. The only option for making payments in the office is through Eftpos.

This year there will be a new payment system for things like gala days, fundraising and missions. Details of the new payment system with instructions will be sent out soon.

Leaving St Joseph's



A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term.

Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a 40 week year.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.


