Last weekend we celebrated the feast of the Holy Trinity. Through the readings we get glimpses of who God is. This feast is not the time to try and explain how three goes into one! The Trinity is not something

that we can understand and figure out with our reasoning or intellect. We most certainly won't find the explanation to the Trinity by 'googling' it!




The Trinity is a mystery that we are to experience with our hearts not with our heads. It is not a puzzle or a riddle that we are expected to answer or solve. The more we contemplate and pray about the reality and presence of the Trinity in our lives, the more of itself will be revealed to us. Through the Trinity, God creates and loves us, Jesus liberates and saves us and the Spirit encourages and strengthens us. The Trinity offers us a model of sharing, belonging and community. It also challenges our individualism and our demand that our rights be met all the time.

On this feast of the Trinity, let us be mindful of our responsibilities to those around us in our families, our neighbourhood and our parish community.

When I listen to educational speakers commenting on contemporary learning, they often remind us that the jobs that our Kindergarten children will most likely be engaging in, have not even been invented yet. While teachers understand that content is necessary in giving learning a context, they acknowledge that with the continual 'information explosion' it is no longer possible for anyone to know all the information about the world which was once possible and expected by students of the past.

The focus has shifted. Learners are required to do more than 'know' but rather are required to think and to do this in conjunction with other thinkers. They are required to be adaptable, flexible, be creative, be problem solvers, be inventors, ask



questions, manage and give feedback and more importantly manage change; to learn, unlearn and relearn. Children are required to work cooperatively, to organise and pace their assignments, work independently, and keep on task. How often have we as adults been required to do this in our workplaces?

These skills require students to accept responsibility for their own learning and this begins with accepting responsibility for their own behaviour. This is an empowering position as it is teaching children that they are capable of being in control of outcomes. When reading reports I am always keenly interested in whether the child is beginning to take responsibility for their own actions; including that of learning and if they are developing collaborative skills. I am interested in their ability to demonstrate independence and organisational skills and if they are beginning to show empathy emotional intelligence towards others.

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As you read your child's report I encourage you to spend time discussing this and to assist them to work towards an enthusiastic and conscientious approach to all they do.

#### Parent Portal



In earlier communications with you this term I have indicated that at the end of term 2 we are no longer using Skoolbag to communicate information to parents and carers. In line with the Parramatta Diocese, we have been sending all information via email using the COMPASS platform. This is the platform all parents and carers can access to gain daily information about their child's attendance, notices, semester reports and in the future as the system expands, access to online booking for interviews.

I invite you to use the parent username and temporary password emailed to you a few weeks ago, to access the COMPASS Parent Portal. If you are having problems or did not receive the email, please contact the office for assistance.

# **Message from Mrs Borg**

#### **Semester One Reports**



The teachers are in the final stages of writing report comments for each student based on their learning throughout the first Semester. When writing student reports, our teachers use data from many assessments, daily work samples, participation and student responses during class activities and daily observations, in accordance with the outcomes and standards outlined in the NSW Curriculum.

Each grade introduces different concepts, content units and skills which can increase in difficulty from the year before. It is therefore possible that your child's achievement level in a particular Key Learning Area may change.

Semester One Reports will be sent home to parents in Week 9. It is extremely important for all families to have acted upon our recent email invitation to sign into the Compass Parent Portal. Semester Two Reports **will not** be sent home in hard copy and will only be available for parents via the Compass Parent Portal app.

The common grade scale shown below is used to report student achievement in both Primary (1-6) and Secondary (7-10) years in all NSW schools. Kindergarten has a different achievement scale. It is important to note that:

- There are no predetermined number for each achievement levels to be allocated
- Each Key Learning Area must have an overall achievement level indicated
- It is important to note than this reporting process is not based on a bell curve
- The overall achievement level is for the whole Key Learning Area (KLA) which may contain many strands. Although some KLA's have been broken into strands, it is important to note that some strands have more weight than others. The overall achievement is not just a straight averaging of strand

Achievement	Descriptor
Outstanding Achievement	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
High Achievement	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
Sound Achievement	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
Basic Achievement	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
Limited Achievement	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

#### **Student Led Conferences**

In Week 10, teachers will be conducting parent interviews to support, discuss and complement these reports, affirm your child's learning and to outline the future learning goals for your child.

During each interview your child will also discuss their learning, highlighting different work samples they are proud of, outline their future learning goals and how they will work with their teachers to achieve these goals. We would



like to remind all parents to ensure their child accompanies them to the interview in Week 10. True partnership between school and home means that common goals can be established and developed more effectively and efficiently. Working together assists the children's development and learning in so many ways.

#### **Attendance Matters**

Thank you to all families who continue to support the school and their child's education by ensuring that their child attends every possible day at school. # **Counsellor's Corner**

This term Mrs Helleur has been part of a CEDP working group reviewing the Bullying Prevention and Response Policy. It's been a privilege to have input into the procedures that our community follows to address this very important issue.

Bullying behaviour has three key features. It involves the intentional misuse of power in a relationship. It is ongoing and repeated, and it involves behaviours that can cause harm. Every conflict isn't bullying and it is important to distinguish bullying from other unkind, mean and harmful behaviour. Calling someone a name or pushing someone once, being rude or having an argument with someone is not bullying. Of course, these behaviours should be addressed but there may be different consequences and interventions, which is why the distinction is critical.

At the core of bullying prevention is promoting kindness, acceptance, and inclusion. By focusing on bringing the community together, children can receive the message that no one should ever experience bullying, and if they do, there are supports in place to help them. It all starts with kindness.

If you are concerned that your child is being bullied, it's important to remain calm and listen carefully. Many children worry about what will happen if they report bullying. Some children blame themselves so it's important to reassure them. You might say things like "That sounds really hard" or "I'm so glad that you've told me, it's important you feel safe at school". Ask your child what they want to do, and what they want you to do. When children contribute to the solution it helps them feel a sense of control. Discuss the idea of talking with school staff and reassure them that the school wants to know and is able to help. Please speak with your child's teacher and, if you need to, ask to talk with the principal.

Many children and young people want to try to deal with the bullying themselves in the first instance. The strategies below may be useful if your child feels safe using these ideas:

- Ignoring the person doing the bullying.
- Telling them to stop and then walking away.
- Pretending you don't care; act unimpressed or not bothered.
- Moving to somewhere safe.

Practising at home can help your child feel more confident about trying the strategies at school.

#### **HOW TO ORDER**

#### OPTION 1 ORDER ONLINE NOW

Online payment options include Visa, Mastercard and PayPal. Alternatively, you can choose to pay over 10 weeks using LatitudePay.

#### STEP 1

Find your school's shared 9 digit community order code on the advancedlife order envelope.



#### STEP 2

Go to www.advancedlife.com.au on your computer, phone or tablet.

Enter your school's 9 digit order code in the 'order & download' box. This will take you to the secure online ordering site for your school.



#### STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and choose your package, then follow the payment process. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available.







#### OPTION 2 CASH/ENVELOPE ORDERING

Schools prefer orders placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

#### STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

#### STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

#### STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on photo day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

If your school chooses to have sibling photographs, you can order online up until midnight the night before photo day. If you miss the midnight deadline, a sibling order envelope including cash payment can be handed directly to our photographers on the day. Please tell your school that your children are to be photographed. Only siblings attending the school are permitted to be photographed.

#### ONLINE ORDER RECEIPTS

An order receipt will be emailed to the email address you provide during the ordering process. Please note that orders placed via PayPal can take up to 48 hours for payment to be processed and a receipt sent.

#### ARE THERE FEES FOR ORDERING ONLINE

There are no fees for LatitudePay or envelope ordering. There is a 1.5% merchant fee applied when using Visa, Mastercard or PayPal. For more information go to:

If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.

#### SPORTS/EXTRA-CURRICULAR PHOTO

Once sports/extra-curricular photos have been taken, your school will forward you a link and a unique online order code that you can use to order sports/extracurricular photos online. A 20% discount is offered for all orders placed within the first 2 weeks. After the 2-week discount period, orders can still be placed online at the standard pricing.

If you prefer to personally collect your photographic package from the school office, rather than have it sent home with your child, please select the "Collect Your Pack" option when you order online.

If your child's image is "not for publication" and your school is aware of your decision, your child should not be presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. All students presented to our photographers by your school for a photo on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages and these packages will be available to purchase.

#### REFUND POLICY

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


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

# **Leaving St Joseph's**



A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term.

Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated based on a 40 week year.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following years' enrolment i.e. the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.
